Dear P6 Parents/Guardians.

#### **Welcome back to West Grove Primary School!**

We hope you have had a rejuvenating and meaningful June holidays with your child. With more relaxed Safe Management Measures (SMMs) in place for COVID-19, the school will continue to plan for engaging and enriching experiences for your child in Term 3.

Since 2019, the Student Development Department (SDD) has adopted the **PROSPER** framework (T. Noble and H. McGrath) to guide us in our students' wellbeing programmes, where we Encourage **Positivity**, Build **Relationships**, Facilitate **Outcomes**, Focus on **Strengths**, Foster a sense of **Purpose**, Enhance **Engagement** and Teach **Resilience**.

As we embark on our exciting journey this term, let us focus on **strengths**. A 'strength' can be a specific skill or ability such as writing, reading, playing music, swimming, cartooning, leadership or even using spreadsheets. It can also be a character trait such as persistence, bravery, kindness to others, sense of humour. The school uses a strengths-based approach to help your child select strategies for the identification of his/her strengths so he/she has opportunities to develop a deep understanding of his/her relative strengths and areas for growth.

It has been reported that when children work with their strengths they tend to learn more readily, perform at a higher level, are more motivated and confident, and have a stronger sense of satisfaction, mastery and competence. The question therefore has been changed from 'how smart is this child?' to 'how is this child smart?'. More importantly, the question has changed from 'ls this child strong?' to 'what are the strengths of this child?'. It is up to us to identify the strengths of each child and help him/her build on their strengths.

#### **Assessment Matters**

We have included the following dates and topics for the Preliminary Examinations which is held in Term 3. We hope that the information will help your child in planning his/her revision.
